- Has been progress since Delhi 2010 in collecting evidence of links between agriculture and nutrition
- Some way to go in relation to design of research and rigour of methods – harmonization of data collection required
- Many studies being conducted but their usefulness can be limited if the right measurements are not made

## KEY MESSAGES 2

---

- ❑ The importance of understanding *how* agriculture links to nutrition outcomes is recognised and the relevance of qualitative methods for achieving this
- ❑ Recognition of the need for multi-sectoral working at all stages of research
- ❑ The issue of gender is very important in the context of nutrition but not just about women
- ❑ More work needed to think through how to evaluate nutrition and health outcomes
- ❑ Need to take account of negative impacts of agriculture on nutrition
